1. LOG IN TO MYGATE PORTAL AND RACERMAIL

Now that you're admitted, it's time to get connected. You should have received an email from Murray State with instructions for setting up your accounts and passwords for the myGate portal and RacerMail. If you have already done this, you are ready to go. If you have not set up your account passwords yet, log into your application account at **getstarted.murraystate.edu**

Look for the "Click here to get started" link in the myGate Portal Access section. When you click on this link, you will be asked to create a password that will be used for your RacerMail (Murray State email account), myGate (student portal) and other network accounts. The password must follow certain rules, so make sure you click on the arrow beside "Password Rules" for information on creating a valid password.

Within the myGate portal, you may apply for scholarships, housing, pay bills, register for classes, view grades and announcements, request transcripts and much more. The myGate portal also connects you to RacerMail, Canvas and the technology Service Catalog – all of which are necessary online tools for success at Murray State.



3. APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Murray State yearly distributes approximately \$44 million in scholarships, grants and tuition waivers. Be sure to apply for scholarships by logging into your myGate portal and clicking on the "Financial Aid" section. Visit: mygate.murraystate.edu

4. APPLY FOR STUDENT VISA

Sign your I-20 or DS-2019 and pay the U.S. Government SEVIS fee (www.fmjfee.com). Apply for an F-1 or J-1 visa at the nearest U.S. consulate or embassy.

5. MAKE TRAVEL PLANS & REGISTER FOR SHUTTLE

Make travel arrangements to arrive in Murray before orientation. There is no public transportation to Murray, but we offer a shuttle service on August 13 -14h from Nashville International Airport (BNA). If you need transportation to Murray, you must make the Nashville, Tennessee airport (BNA) your final destination and register for the shuttle in advance. Greeters will meet you at the airport, if we know your exact arrival information – time of arrival in Nashville, flight name and number. The shuttle will leave from a local hotel each day at 3:00 pm for Murray. Murray is a two hour drive from Nashville. The cost of the shuttle is \$100 and the fee will be billed to your MSU account. 6. REGISTER FOR NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION Our orientation is now online-orienation is mandatory. Sign up for orientation at:
murraystate.edu/internationalorientation

An orientation fee of \$100 will be charged to your student account. Students wishing to move into their residence hall before before orientation dates are charged approximately \$18 per night (subject to change).

7. APPLY FOR HOUSING

Some of the best college memories are made while living on campus. Murray State's residence halls offer a number of perks including common areas, on-site games and free laundry facilities. They're also located a short walk from academic buildings, Winslow Dining Hall, the Wellness Center and our

athletics facilities. Plus, whether you live in an on-campus residential hall or off-campus, you'll join one of Murray State's eight residential colleges. Consider it your tight-knit community within the larger University community. You'll meet fellow students, get connected to faculty and gain opportunities for personal and professional growth. 8. BRING FINAL TRANSCRIPTS AND DIPLOMA

Don't forget to bring official transcripts in order to complete your admission file during orientation. You will submit these sealed documents to the admissions office to finalize your admission.



9. Complete Online Orientation Prior to Arrival

Online orientation is mandatory for all new international students. Online orientation will cover areas such as course registration, adjusting to campus life, getting a student ID card, arranging housing, purchasing health insurance, purchasing meal plans, discussing immigration regulations that govern your visa, and working on campus. We look forward to welcoming you to one of the friendliest towns in America!

10. TAKE THE MATH PLACEMENT TEST

If you are an undergraduate student, you will be required to take the KYOTE Math Placement test during orientation. The KYOTE Placement Exams are free. A calculator may be used on the KYOTE Placement Exams, but the calculator must not have a computer algebra system installed on it.

11. FEE PAYMENT

Students and parents have several payment options available to pay the balance of their Murray State student account. Options for payment include bank or credit card and international wire transfer. It is

important that you have the necessary funding for your studies beforehand, as you will not be allowed to take courses without payment or enrollment in a payment plan.

12. PARTICIPATE IN GREAT BEGINNINGS

Great Beginnings are on the horizon for you here at Murray State and the best way to begin your Racer journey! An annual tradition at Murray State, Great Beginnings gives all new students the opportunity to familiarize themselves with campus and the community, easing the transition to campus life. From Exploring Murray to the Hypnotist (a campus favorite!), and going to a campus- wide water balloon fight, students find themselves making new friends and getting to know campus better.

Students living on campus will all have a Great Beginnings Leader who will help to guide you through all the fun and educational events happening in the first few weeks of classes. Classes begin on August 20th. Go to class ready and energized to start your studies in your new home.





Requirements for "home-country" health insurance:

All students must have health insurance. You can purchase insurance from your home country, or purchase insurance during orientation through: www.isoa.org/murray_state_university

New and returning students should make sure that if they are using insurance from their home-country that their policy meets the following minimum requirements. Failure to meet these basic requirements will delay your enrollment in classes. You will have to buy the insurance plan provided through the university.

- 1. The policy must be written by the carrier, in English, and premium rates must be in U.S. dollar amounts.
- 2. The policy must include in-patient and out-patient coverage for both accident and illness.
- 3. The policy must have a deductible of no more than \$500 per individual, per accident or illness.
- 4. The policy must state a maximum benefit of no less than \$100,000 per accident or illness. The policy must provide no less than \$50,000 provision for medical evacuation to a student's home country.
- 5. The policy must provide no less than \$25,000 provision for repatriation (after death, removal of remains to a student's home country).
- 6. The policy must clearly state coverage dates from the first day of classes for the semester applying until the end of the semester

How to pay the SEVIS fee after receiving your I-20 or DS-2019:

All persons applying for an F-1 visa must now pay a \$350 non-refundable fee to the U.S. Government. Those with J-1 visas must pay \$220. The process for payment is explained below:

- 1. You will receive your I-20 or DS-2019 from Murray State. If you have access to a credit card and the internet, visit the following site: www.fmjfee.com.
- 2. Complete the online form I-901 as instructed on the web page. (You will need your I-20 or DS-2019, your passport, a major credit card, the address you wish the receipt to be mailed to, along with other information such as birthday and country of citizenship.)
- 3. After completing the online application and submitting the form you will be prompted to pay with a credit card or check (it is hoped that Western Union may be an option in the near future as well. Please contact us if Western Union would be a better option).
- 4. Once you have completed the whole process you will be prompted to print out an online receipt. MAKE SURE THAT YOU DO THIS. The paper receipt may take as much as 4-5 weeks to reach you if it reaches you at all. Take this online receipt with you to your visa interview if you have not received the official mailed receipt prior to your interview date.
- 5. Once you have completed this process it will take approximately 3 working days (Monday through Friday, excluding holidays) for the consulates to be updated.
- 6. You may make your visa interview prior to paying the fee but you must complete the above process at least 3 working days before the interview to make sure the consulate is updated before your interview.
- 7. Remember that this fee is non-refundable and is in addition to the visa fee that will be charged when you go for your visa interview.

Steps for the online housing application

- Students must have a university issued M# (ID #) before they can begin the online application process. Students will be issued an M# upon being admitted to the university.
- The online housing application is accessible through myGate. Students will need to log into myGate to begin the process.
- Once a student has successfully logged into myGate, he or she will need to click on the navy blue money tab at the top of the screen.
- The online housing application link is located at the bottom of the page on the right-hand side.
- Click on the blue online housing application link.
- Click on the white application link at the top of the screen.
- Students will be asked to make payment of the \$150 housing deposit.
- Students will be asked to enter their M# throughout the process, so they are advised to keep it handy.
- Students may go back into the application to make any necessary changes (i.e., to request a specific roommate or to change building preferences) after they have begun the process.
- Students may request one specific roommate on the application; however, in order to find a roommate to request within the system, the student they are trying to request as a roommate must have also started the online application.
