Submitting your DS-160 online application electronically is the first step in the visa application process. Review the Embassy [or Consulate Internet page of the Embassy or Consulate where you wish to apply for your visa for the next step](#). Most visa applicants require a visa interview, although some applicants are eligible for the visa renewal category. See the Embassy or Consulate's specific local instructions for information about the Embassy or Consulate interview or about submitting your visa application, and other frequently asked questions.

**You must bring** the confirmation page and the following documents with you to the service center:

**Passport; I-20A or B/or I-20MN; Proof of SEVIS registration and fee payment**

You may also provide any documents that you think may be helpful in your case.



## Instructions

Be sure to submit this confirmation page with a clear and legible barcode at your interview. If you are unable to print at this time, choose to have the confirmation page emailed to an email address. You can print or email your application form for your records. You do not need to submit the application form at the time of the interview.

Please note that you will need to provide evidence of payment of the visa application fee and other related fees with your application. There may be other fees associated with the visa application process. Please check your country's fees. Exchange Schedule for any other fees you may incur.

You indicated that you are applying for an F, M, or J visa. If you are not returning to the same program and/or have dropped out of student status, you must pay the SEVIS fee ( <http://www.ice.gov/sevis/> ). Bring your SEVIS fee receipt to the interview. The fee must be paid at least three business days prior to your appointment date.

NOTE: Except where the interview is not waived, you must provide a biometric signature on your application in the same manner as you provided fingerprints in front of a consular officer. By providing a biometric signature, you are certifying, under penalty of perjury, that you have read and understood the questions in the nonimmigrant visa application and that all statements made by you in the nonimmigrant visa application are true and have been completed to the best of your knowledge and honesty. And at the interview, you must certify, under penalty of perjury, that all statements made in your application and during the interview are true and have been completed to the best of your knowledge and honesty.

Unless exempted by the rules, you must electronically sign your application, even if the application is prepared by someone other than you. Your electronic signature certifies that you have read and understood the questions in this application, and that to the best of your knowledge and belief your answers are true and correct. All declarations on this application are unsworn declarations under the penalty of perjury (28 U.S.C. 1746).

The information you provide on your application and other information you submit with your application may be used by other government agencies, legal or other statutory authorities for law enforcement and immigration law enforcement purposes. The photograph you provide with your application may be used for employment verification or other U.S. legal purposes.
